10:45-12:00 **Senator Peter Mills; “Healthcare Reform”** "America's health reform law will extend the most costly and least efficient health care system in the world to another 35 million people, many of whom are dying for lack of access. Although we share a moral imperative to cover the uninsured, we cannot afford to do so without fixing the system.

"America spends about 17% of GDP on health care in contrast to the 10% spent by our peer nations. That means health care extracts a 7% sales tax on all the goods and services that our economy can produce. Medicare alone carries a \$34 trillion unfunded liability. Bringing efficiency to health care is the biggest challenge to America's economic security and the largest component of our debt burden.

"The Accountable Care Act of 2010 carries the hope that states will implement a variety of suggested reforms to bring costs under control. These include global and bundled payment systems, the creation of "medical homes", the development of "accountable care organizations" and the "meaningful use" of health IT.

"Most of these measures must be implemented by state level initiatives. Nimble states like Maine that can march out ahead will be the first to reap the economic benefits while sharing in the social responsibility of meeting the needs of vulnerable populations."

DIRECTIONS TO MAPLE HILL FARM BED & BREAKFAST INN

(a detailed map can be found at www.MapleBB.com/map.jpg):

From the South: Take I-95 North. You will then need to take an exit just south of Portland onto I-295 north at Exit 44, or north of Portland at Exit 52 onto the Falmouth Spur over to I-295 north. Continue taking I-295 north which reconnects with I-95 north just south of Augusta, and continue on I-95 north. Take Exit 109, the first Augusta Exit, off I-95.

From the North: Take Exit 109A, the last Augusta Exit, off I-95. (Don't take Exit 109B, since this just misses the next turn!)

Then, from either direction: Stay in the left lane on the exit ramp for Route 202 West (toward Winthrop), then as soon as you get onto Route 202 West, scoot over into the left turn lane and take a left turn onto Whitten Road (at the first traffic light only a few hundred feet from the end of the exit ramp). Then just watch carefully for our blue and white signs directing you through a series of turns during the next 4 miles to Maple Hill Farm Bed and Breakfast on the Inn Road (our driveway) off the Outlet Road in Hallowell. (Be careful not to miss the second sign just after you turn off Whitten Road which directs you to turn left onto Town Farm road!)

Alternate Directions:

From **Downtown** Augusta rotary, take Route 201 South about 1 1/2 miles (or From **Downtown** Gardiner -- *NOT the Gardiner Interstate exit* -- take Route 201 North about 4 miles), then turn away from the river onto Central Street in Downtown Hallowell at the Clock (right turn from Augusta, left turn from Gardiner) and proceed about 3 miles, following the blue and white signs to Maple Hill Farm Bed and Breakfast on the Inn Road (our driveway) off the Outlet Road in Hallowell.
